Exam Make-up Policy: A planned absence from an exam must be approved by the instructor a minimum of two weeks before the exam date. In case of a serious emergency on the day of the exam, contact me by phone or email within 24 hours of the exam in order to be considered for a make-up exam.

Homework and Assignments: Homework practice problems will be assigned on a daily basis. Make sure you complete, understand, and are able to do the practice problems. In addition, specific assignments will be collected. These assignments will appear as a combination of quizzes, group work, take-home assignments, and Mathematica labs. Practice problems and assignments will be announced in class and also posted on the class website. Your lowest two scores will be dropped. Late assignments are generally not accepted.

Exit Policy: In order to receive a passing grade for the course, students must pass a gateway exam in integration. The passing level for this exam is 90% and it will be given once during a regular class period. Students may retake the exam in my office, during office hours, after it has been given in class. The maximum number of attempts at the exam for any one day is two. After two failures, students must wait until the next day to retake the exam again. Students who are passing the

course, but do not pass the gateway exam, will be given an incomplete for the class. Students who are failing the course will receive an F whether or not they have passed the gateway exam.
